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AAGPNE - Terms of Reference

- Be a forum for collaborative curriculum development and information sharing for General Practice Nursing (GPN) education across the 4 countries of the UK
- Raise the profile of General Practice Nursing and foster and disseminate excellence in practice.
- Provide support, advice and mentorship to members, encouraging and supporting individual professional growth and development
- Share and develop educational and research expertise to influence policy and the principles and practice of General Practice Nursing.
- Develop links with other organisations to share and develop information and, where appropriate, resources.
- Respond to government consultations and, where appropriate, lobby government agencies.

AAGPNE - Terms of Reference

Title: Association of Academic General Practice Nurse Educators

Status: "an independent, non-governmental, not for profit association of members"

Mission: To co-ordinate and represent an association of Higher Education Institutions academics (and professionals) in the UK who have a common interest in the education and development of General Practice Nurses.

Activities: As ToR

Membership: Members are any academic nursing staff in HEIs preparing or delivering programmes of education and curricula that develop and prepare nurses to work in a range of roles in General Practice.

Membership fees: Initially the development of this group is pump-primed by the QNI for two years. Members will have to decide if they wish to continue after this period where there is likely to be a fee paid for by individuals or their HEI.

Organisation and Governance: Committee structure:

- Chair
- Deputy Chair
- Secretary
- Treasurer (if self supporting)
- Webmaster?

AAGPNE Committee

The committee should have at least the following elected members:

- The Chairperson
- Deputy Chair
- Secretary
- ? Treasurer if self supporting

Key steps:

- Agree committee name
- Name lead person
- Name the members of the committee
- State of purpose /scope of the committee
- Timelines must be in place to communicate to the rest of the AAGPNE.

Process:

Nominations: identify person/s showing interest for each of the roles, a person agreeing the nomination, seconds this nomination — a vote/ showing of hands from the AAAGPNE group is sufficient to show all agree. Results of all votes and those nominated are recorded in the minutes.

Voluntary Standards for nurses new to general practice nursing

Progress:

- Standards to underpin future GPN programmes nationally – to ensure consistency
- Thus far, identified mixed titles for introductory programmes - Foundation/Fundamentals!
- Scoping exercise (Survey Monkey) undertaken with HEI colleagues
- 26 responses -

Key themes

- At least 3 HEIs ceased to provide GPN provision Training hubs.
- Title Foundation programme
- 25:1 HEIs provide Introduction to GPN programmes or modules
- Programmes vary from offering 30 credits at Foundation
- Duration of programmes 4 weeks to 2 years P/T mostly F/T 12 mnths
- Face to face and blended learning with at least 20 hours practice time.
- Funding HEE
- Practice based mentors essential RCGP competencies
 25:1
- Cohorts range from 6 50 students

Learning from each other – 2.30-3.45

- GPN education in Scotland, Wales, Northern Ireland
- Findings from the QNI/QNIS GPN standards project
- Consistency in fundamentals/foundation programmes
- Sign off mentors for GPN SPQ programmes
